Mr. Baker earned a PhD in sociology and social psychology from the University of Utah. He is retired from an aerospace and business management career.





For those of you who have DNA tested there is a whole new world of information available for you. If you used FamilyTree DNA they now have an excellent Blog available at https://blog.familytreedna.com/ Learn more about FamilyTreeDNA, read customer journeys, and discover the world of DNA!

Their available resources are to numerous to list here but do range from "A Guide to Spanish Surnames and Forenames: History, Structure, and Genealogy" to "Ancient Lineages: A 49,000-Year-Old Branch Split in Y-DNA Haplogroup E Confirmed 15 Years After Initial Discovery".

You can reach these by using the above Blog URL or by logging into your FTDNA account and going to "Blog" below ABOUT at the bottom of your Home page.

Family Tree DNA has made a huge improvement in their available tools for their customers.



AncestryDNA also has considerable resources available for their customers. Log into your ancestry.com account and click on DNA. A detail drop down list will appear and you can proceed from there. If you have responded to their questions you might like their Summary. I usually go directly to Matches where I have maintained my connections as closely as is possible with the quantity I have received from this service. I pay particular attention to Sorting by newest matches then clicking on the individual's name followed by clicking on Shared Matches. This takes me directly to list of any of their matches that we share I common. I then code them to my family group or groups. It provides a great deal of clarity to who fits where. https://www.ancestry.com/discoveryui-matches/compare/

Using these tools should make your research more meaningful and rewarding.
